Awareness Foundation Ambassadors for Peace: Syria & Iraq

The Awareness Foundation's programme to equip young Syrian and Iraqi men and women to become peacemakers and reconcilers in their communities



In October 2017, The Revd Nadim Nassar, Executive Director, and Huda Nassar (Director for the Middle East) travelled to Lattakia, Syria for a brand-new development in our Awareness Foundation Ambassadors for Peace programme. For the first time, two separate groups of Ambassadors would be working: a new group of 65 young people just beginning on their journey as Ambassadors, and 35 of our Ambassadors who were chosen by their peers at previous events to lead the project-management stage of their work.

Advanced Programme: Lattakia, Syria 2017

Over three days, our advanced group of Ambassador 'project managers' studied very diligently, brilliantly taught by Dr Pierre Filifli, a Public Project Management expert from Lebanon (pictured below). This is the first in a series



of events designed to train the Ambassadors fully so that they can implement their own peace-building projects which will benefit the wider community. There will be a further four training sessions, covering topics including how

to write a proposal, strategic thinking, communication skills and leadership.

The engagement by the young Ambassadors was inspiring. They were challenged by what they learned, and their response was to push themselves even harder. These young people are all graduates, and among them we counted 7 engineers

7 doctors and a number of teachers and Aque businesspeople.

Introductory Programme: Lattakia 2017

It was such a joy to welcome a new group of young people!

This is the first time that we have run two separate groups of Awareness Foundation Ambassadors for Peace in the same location. We used to bring up to 100 young people together for this programme, but over the years we have learnt that we should focus on quality rather than quantity. So we split the Ambassadors into two groups: one advanced (see left) and a new group who are much earlier on their



journeys.

The theme was *"Let light shine out of darkness"* (2 Corintihans 4:6a). Over three days, the young people learned about citizenship, reconciliation, and the relationship between light & darkness, peace & war, and the Cross & the Resurrection. We were greatly helped by our new Middle East Consultant *Fr Amer Kassar* from Damascus and *Fr Michael Naaman* from Homs; both of our friends drew on their extraordinary experiences of the conflict in their teaching.



We also gave them spiritual nourishment; we were blessed to have *Mr Elias Jabbour* and his wife *Petra Antoun* for the first time with us as our prayer and worship leaders.

Ambassadors for Peace: Erbil, Iraq 2017

In July 2017, Nadim and Huda travelled to Erbil in Iraqi Kurdistan for our Awareness Foundation Ambassadors for Peace.

Over 60 young men and women from different denominations joined us in Erbil to begin the third stage of their journey. The theme of this event was 2 Corinthians 4:7-10 (*treasure in jars of clay*). Our event had two aspects: a continuing of spiritual care and support, and the opportunity to make a genuine difference to the community. Father Nadim taught about God's treasures that lie within each of us and how we can be the image of God's love in our lives. Huda led sessions on citizenship and on the practical and spiritual meaning of being an Ambassador. The young people prepared prayers & worship themselves, and we were hugely honoured when the Syrian Orthodox Bishop, *Mousa Al-Shaman*, and *Fr Jacob* and *Fr Dawood* visited us one evening; this was a great boost for us all, showing the Church's deeper recognition and support for our work. We should like to offer special thanks to Father Boulos *Aleframi*; without his help, we would have been unable to have held this event.



In the main part of the event, the young people were split into groups of 15, and each group then chose two people to represent them. This was their first taste of democracy, and every person had the opportunity to put themselves in the spotlight, telling their peers why they would make good representatives. Then each of the groups, led by their representatives, developed two peace-building projects, including objectives, budget, implementation, and how to measure success. We then united the young Ambassadors for some more democracy: the group representatives campaigned for their own projects, before everyone voted for the winning two 2 projects.

We were amazed at the level of work the young people had put into their projects, every one of which was viable, practical and inspirational. The winners were:

Street children (age 5 to 10): a project to help Erbil's many street children, listening to them, providing them with food and clothing, and encouraging them to go back to school. They would not be given money as this would make the children a target of the many gangs.

First aid training: offering training for everyone. Medicine is expensive, and medical treatment difficult to obtain. The ready availability of trained first-aiders would save lives.

Next time, we shall begin to train the young people to become skilled project developers.

Awareness Foundation Little Heroes: Lattakia, Syria

The Awareness Foundation's programme that gives Syrian children a new hope and a new energy to live their life without fear, enabling them to build new bridges of respect and understanding.

In early August, Huda and her team of volunteers welcomed around 200 displaced and local Syrian children to our Little Heroes camp. Once again, we were hosted by the National Evangelical Church in Lattakia.

The theme of the three days was "the Story of the Field". A field is a place of work and it sustains life, and the analogy we drew was that we must each work to take care of our own body and our spirit and work hand-inhand if we are to thrive as the children of God.

We followed this theme in our Bible Studies, as well as through a specially-written play which was acted out over the three days. Seven of our volunteer leaders acted in the play. Before each scene, Orange (Rana) and Apple (Wadia) taught the children the message of the day through discussing how they could be friends and work together, despite their obvious differences.



The three days reflected on

- freeing ourselves of hatred, fear and negativity;
- working to be a positive and good member of the community; and
- how God will know us by the fruits of our labours.

We divided the children according to their talents, forming five groups: theatre, music, art, crafts and writing. We presented each group with their own challenge, which was to use their talents to reflect on the theme of the programme.

It takes a lot of work to prepare for, teach and look after 200+ children. We pay special tribute to the many young people who give up their time to work on Little Heroes. Their dedication, generosity and care are a huge element in the success story of our Little Heroes programme.

They were very impressed with what they saw, and we now have a long list of new children, waiting to take their place as Little Heroes. Awareness Foundation Little Heroes: Safita, Syria

After Awareness Foundation Little Heroes in Lattakia, our team of volunteers travelled 75 miles south to Safita at the invitation of our dear friend and International Consultant Bishop Demetrios Charbak, the Greek Orthodox Bishop of Banias.

This was our second year in Safita. Over 350 children of every denomination were waiting eagerly for us. As before, the theme for this year was "**the Story of the Field**".

Each day started with prayer, followed by a Bible story, reflections on the story, scenes from a play, art and craft activity, singing Hymns, and sports and games. During the day, we stopped for two short breaks and lunch. The children particularly enjoyed learning a new Hymn over the course of the three days, as well as a new Verse from the Bible each day, and each verse was presented in a new way. We also did this in Lattakia.

We found out that the children were so keen that they were arriving at the Essam Freij Centre even before the leaders. This experience has made the

children stronger, it has given them reassurance and comfort, and they have all made many new friends to support them in the year ahead. We believe that we have achieved our goal in both cities to bring a smile to the children and to give them a new certainty and hope.

At the end, the children did not want to go home and this gives us even more energy to bring the

Little Heroes programme to all communities in Syria and beyond. We could not have achieved our goals without the support of our team of volunteers from Lattakia, and we thank each of them.

We are especially grateful to all who generously supported this project, and to Ajnahat Al-Nasour, a Christian group which prepared and planned all of our games.



North America

Our friends in Canada and the United States work to spread our teaching and to raise funds for our work.

We are very grateful to everyone who took part in the discussions that led to our Action Plan.

Another direct result of our meeting was Father Nadim's trip to Toronto, Philadelphia and North Carolina. Nadim preached at Grace Church onthe-Hill, met senior clergy and even spoke at a Canadian International Council presentation in Toronto. After stopping off briefly in Washington for a meeting to discuss marketing



and PR, Nadim went with Chris Bunting, Chair of Awareness Foundation America, to take part in a large fundraising event in Philadelphia arranged by Amin Al-Laty, whom Nadim has known since the Lebanese Civil War.

Finally, Nadim flew to North Carolina to meet Christian businesspeople and leading clergy in Winston-Salem and Charlotte. For this leg of his trip, Nadim was joined by Nigel Macdonald, our own Chair of Trustees, for a special meeting with J. Frank Harrison III and Josh Dorminy.

Huda in Jordan

In October, Huda Nassar was invited by Wilton Park (an executive agency sponsored by the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office) to participate in their "Youth as Peacemakers" dialogue in Jordan. The conference showcased emerging local initiatives to empower young people and support them in their role in peacemaking and peacebuilding. The conference was attended by Prince Hassan of Jordan and the British Ambassador.

Representatives from around the world talked about their experiences in peacebuilding with young people. Other topics included 'Islam for the youth generation' and 'Building a culture of peace to promote peaceful change'. This meeting was very positive, with much sharing of experience and best practice, and the inclusion of a number of Youth Ambassadors from the UK, Kenya, Jordan and Lebanon ensured that this was not just an academic discussion!

These meetings are an ideal opportunity for the Awareness Foundation to build relationships with thought-leaders and to create partnerships for the future.

Through PAX, a new programme of the Awareness Foundation, we seek to redress the balance by providing thought-provoking short films that challenge viewers to recognise the world-changing power of a living faith. Our videos demonstrate an authentic and relevant Christianity that celebrates diversity and provides an answer to extremism and hatred.

We are fortunate to have Josie Child as our Producer. Josie joined the Awareness Foundation in 2016 after graduating with first class honours from Durham University. She has been involved in Christian education since setting up a Christian Union at her school. Josie was also a key member of her university's TV and film-making society, Durham Student Productions. Josie received the Duke of Edinburgh Award in 2010.

Our videos cover a wide range of relevant topics, some of which you can see in the box, top right. Through discussion of topics such as politics and faith, interfaith relationships, and how to combat extremism, PAX seeks to build peace through insisting upon compassion and respect. We are passionate about equipping communities and individuals to recognise the world-changing power of a living faith.

PAX has two broad aims:

- to encourage Christians to live out their faith practically and confidently, and
- to provide a counter-narrative of peace and understanding to hateful, extremist, and ignorant ideologies online.
